## *Scaevola aemula* 'Topaz Pink'

This hardy and easy to grow native groundcover reaches about 30cm tall with a spread of 80cm. Doing best in full sun to part shade in most well-drained soils, it's great for mass-planting or for cascading over walls and embankments and also does well in containers and hanging baskets. Just remember to cut it back after flowering finishes. 'Topaz Pink' is available in NSW, Vic, SA and Tas, but only in limited numbers.



## *Salvia* 'Celestial Blue'

Growing about 1.2m tall with a spread of 1.8m, this dryness-tolerant perennial has aromatic leaves, a long flowering season and is very easy to grow in average soils. Prune it back by half after the main flowering season ends, to tidy things up and encourage a dense habit. It can be mass-planted and is well suited for borders, dry gardens, coastal areas and herb gardens. 'Celestial Blue' is available in NSW, SA and Tas, in limited numbers.



## *Tristaniopsis laurina* dwarf 'Winter Red'

'Winter Red' forms a round, dense ball with rich bronze-red new growth in winter. It grows to about 1.7m all round and has clusters of soft yellow flowers in summer. Taking sun or part-shade in both coastal and inland areas, as well as being frost- and drought-tolerant, this is a good native substitute for the popular exotic, *Photinia* and can be used for hedges or as an accent colour in the garden.
